Eligibility

To be eligible to stand as a Parish Councillor in the UK, you must meet the following criteria:

- Be at least 18 years old on the day of your nomination.
- Be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen, or a citizen of any member state of the European Union.
- Be registered to vote in the parish, or have lived, worked, or owned property in the parish or within three miles of it for at least 12 months prior to the day of your nomination.

Certain disqualifications apply, such as being employed by the parish council or having been sentenced to a term of imprisonment of three months or more within the last five years.
